LINCOLN UNIVERSITY DAILY COVID-19 SCREENING STATION QUESTIONS. JUNE 18, 2020

To comply with the revised Alameda Co. Health Order 20-14a that allows Lincoln to allow in-class instruction, Lincoln needs to have COVID-19 Screening Stations. Our screening stations will be the reception positions, which are at the entrance of all three of our campus buildings. Before you are allowed daily access to the interior of the building, you will need to provide an oral answer to the three screening questions listed below to the receptionist/screener. The screener may read the questions to you, or ask you to read them yourself. If you answer, "yes," to any of the questions; you will be asked to go home and will be provided an Alameda Co. Health Department quarantine packet. If you answer, "no," to all three, you may enter the building.

- 1. WITHIN THE LAST 10 DAYS HAVE YOU BEEN DIAGNOSIED WITH COVID-19 OR HAD A TEST CONFIRMING YOU HAVE THE VIRUS?
- 2. DO YOU LIVE IN THE SAME HOUSEHOLD WITH, OR HAVE YOU HAD CLOSE CONTACT ** IN THE PAST 14 DAYS WITH SOMEONE WHO HAS BEEN IN ISOLATION FOR COVID-19 OR HAD A TEST CONFORMING THEY HAVE THE VIRUS?
- 3. HAVE YOU HAD ONE OR MORE OF THESE SYMPTOMS TODAY OR WITHIN THE PAST 24 HOURS, WHICH IS NEW OR NOT EXPLAINED BY A REASON OTHER THAN POSSIBLY HAVING COVID-19?
 - a. Fever, Chills, or Repeated Shaking/Shivering
 - b. Cough
 - c. Sore Throat
 - d. Shortness of Breath, Difficulty Breathing
 - e. Feeling Unusually Weak or Fatigued
 - f. Loss of taste or Smell
 - g. Muscle Pain
 - h. Headache
 - i. Runny or Congested Nose
 - j. Diarrhea
 - k. Nausea and Vomiting

If you answered YES to any of the questions, they must be sent home and follow the isolation/quarantine steps.

** "Close Contact" is defined as living in the same house, being an intimate partner, being a caregiver, or being within 6 feet of an individual for longer than 15 minutes who has COVID-19
